Over 700 Azerbaijani servicemen and new officer cadets were introduced to North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) during a NATO Allied Command Transformation (ACT) sponsored event held in Baku from 29 October through 2 November.

Introduced in 2007, NATO Days Azerbaijan provides NATO education to teachers, command staff and cadets of the Azerbaijani Armed Forces.

The 2012 NATO Days Azerbaijan introduced military attendees to NATO's history, organization and structure, goals and policies, strategies and concepts, partnership, and peacekeeping and crises response operations. The event is interactive providing attendees the opportunities to question and discuss NATO operations, future planning and NATO education/ training programs in non-attribution small forum discussions.
