

SACT's first visit to the NATO school: at the heart of NATO's learning process - ACT

During his first visit to the NATO School on the occasion of the Defence Planning Symposium 15 January, General Jean-Paul Paloméros also celebrated the NATO School's 60th anniversary and took part in the opening of the anniversary exhibition.

During the inauguration, together with the mayor of Oberammergau, Mr Arno Nunn and the NATO School Commandant, Colonel Mark Baines, Paloméros underlined the relevance of the School as a multinational installation for training and education: "I'm very pleased to have this opportunity to visit this cornerstone of NATO's knowledge in Bavaria for the first time and to have the opportunity to celebrate the 60th anniversary of its creation". The local mayor of Oberammergau, Mr Arno Nunn, compared the School with the big constant of Oberammergau, the Passion Play. After 60 years the NATO School Oberammergau is such a constant, too, the mayor stated. He said that he appreciates the win-win situation for both the region and the School and is happy to welcome numerous international visitors every year.

Earlier in the morning Paloméros took part to the first session of the Defence Planning Symposium (DPS), an annual event organised to stimulate discussion on defence planning and capability development topics. The overall theme this time was "Leading NATO to 2020 and beyond".
