



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

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The confluence of **political**, **social**, **technological**, **economic**, and **environmental** trends are redefining the global security context:

- The world is transforming at an exponential rate
- The confluence of trends resulting in complexity, disorder and uncertainty
- Rapid changes are driven by technology and interconnectedness
- Growing inequalities brought on by globalization will continue to undermine Western cohesion
- Global power shift continues toward multi-polarity
- Nationalist reactions are growing

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

INSTABILITY SITUATIONS, STRATEGIC MILITARY PERSPECTIVES, MILITARY IMPLICATIONS (2015, 2017)



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Aim: To identify characteristics and abilities of a future Alliance pool of forces to meet the potential demands of the future security environment today through the foreseeable future, 2035 and beyond.

The Military Problem: Based on the possible instability situations in the future security environment through 2035 and beyond, what is a framework that will enable the success of NATO military forces at its core tasks?

This document provides **Bi-Strategic Command best military advice**, focused on both challenges and opportunities for the Alliance. To keep the military edge and prevail in the future, NATO forces should continually evolve, adapt, and innovate and be **CREDIBLE**, **NETWORKED**, **AWARE**, **AGILE** and **RESILIENT**.

This document is updated on a **four-year cycle** in concert with the NATO Defence Planning Process.

In development of FFAO 2018, the goal was to retain the best parts of FFAO 2015 but expand analysis into new areas both adding depth and relevance.

Regional Perspectives



Aim: Regional Perspectives Workshops (RPWs) will facilitate discussion and interaction between NATO Command Structure and Agencies, NATO and Partner Nations, NATO COEs, International Organizations, Industry, Think Tanks and Academia on developments in regions relevant to NATO and Euro- Atlantic security such as the Arctic/High North, Russia and Eastern Europe, Asia-Pacific, and North Africa.

RPWs will be planned in 2018 and executed in 2019 to provide in-depth analysis and different points of view in support of decision-makers in the development of new Military Strategy as well as to support the development of the SFA 2021 Report.



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Russia & Eastern Europe - Political Theme

Analysis of trends and implications:

- Russia is likely to continue challenge the liberal world order
- Russia may continue to focus on creating an Atlantic divide by using hybrid warfare tools
- EU Russia competition for increasing influence in Eastern Europe, Balkans, Baltics will continue

Key areas/concerns/issues:

- Russian election 2024 the future of democracy and power transition
- Breakdown of international structures/agreements and confidence building measures established before and after the end of the Cold War
- Russia-China cooperation

Initial ideas for call for papers:

 Russian use of cyber domain to intervene elections/social structures in Eastern Europe
