Fact Sheet - Operational Logistics Chain Management

Background: Operational Logistics Chain Management (OLCM) is a collaborative Command and

Control capability that provides the people, processes, and tools for Nations to optimise logistics support. It is the bridge to achieving SACT's Comprehensive NATO Logistics Network envisioned under ACT's Logistic and Sustainability focus area. The OLCM program focuses on developing the Doctrine, Organisation, Training, Materiel, Leadership, Personnel, Facilities, and Interoperability (DOTMLPFI) lines of development. This includes generating the OLCM Concept; OLCM CONOPS;

developing the required process and procedures to enable collective logistics (Unified -Business Process Model (U- BPM)); and identified the User Operating Requirements for the Logistic Functional Services (LOG FS) tool set (CP42/43 & 44/46). The NATO Logistic Committee approved the OLGM Beadman for

44/46). The NATO Logistic Committee approved the OLCM Roadmap for Implementation.

In 2019, OLCM will be a part of the TRIDENT JUPITER (TRJU19) exercise series and CAPABLE LOGISTICIAN 2019. TRJU19 offers an excellent opportunity to assess the satisfaction of acceptance criteria for the DOT_LPFI aspects of the OLCM Capability. Additionally, both exercises offer an opportunity to assess the OLCM Roadmap milestone implementation at the JLSG, National, and Tactical levels. The exercise Training Audience will use the OLCM processes and procedures (in the form of the Electronic U-BPM (EUBPM)) in accordance with SACEUR SAGE 2019 guidance.
