## 2020 Fact Sheet – Autonomous Last Mile Resupply

**Background**: As part of the Military Use of Autonomy, Automation and Robotics (MUAAR)

LOE, the Autonomous Last Mile Resupply experiment will attempt to

demonstrate the autonomous requirements for triggering, launch, and delivery of specific munitions to specific personnel in a field-firing environment. Use of dedicated coloured submunition rounds will visually demonstrate the accuracy and reliability of an autonomous (pilotless) drone in take-off, flight, location of, and delivery to a specified target in open terrain – with no external assistance. If

a success the experiment data will be passed to both Allied Command Transformation Logistics and Medical branches for further development.

Mission: Autonomous delivery of specified payload to specified individuals under field

conditions.
