WDI NATO Alliance Ground Surveillance Force (NAGSF) aligns under Allied Command

Transformation Warfare Development Imperative (WDI) Integrated Multi-Domain

Defence.

Background: This experiment is designed to help advance the effective inclusion of the force's Joint ISR

federated Processing, Exploitation and Dissemination (PED) and aerial collection capabilities in NATO planning and operations. When fully operational, NAGSF will fundamentally change the way NATO tasks, collects, exploits, and shares intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance (ISR) data. Under the current system NATO is reliant on member nations to fulfil requests for the collection and exploitation of ISR data. NAGSF will not only provide NATO's first organic platform that can collect Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) images and Moving Target Indicator (MTI) data, but will provide near-real time (NRT) and forensic level 1 and 2 PED on all source geospatial and MTI data provided by member nations or collected through its own capabilities. The NAGSF data repository will make all finished products and raw data available to all 30 member nations,

streamlining access and improving situational awareness across the Alliance.

Exercising the integration of NAGSF capabilities in exercises is a critical step towards full implementation of all NAGSF capabilities within NATO. This capability integration will enhance understanding of NAGSF's capabilities throughout the alliance while enabling refinement of the employment procedures for intelligence collection and exploitation. Additionally, lessons identified will support the Force's progression toward final

operational capability in 2022.
