Background: NATO CD&E was introduced as a vehicle for NATO transformation in 2003. Over the

years, National representatives recognized the importance of CD&E and requested

formal training for staff members assigned to CD&E posts. Allied Command

Transformation, in coordination with NATO School Oberammergau (NSO), developed education and training for NATO military and civilian personnel assigned to NATO CD&E

positions and organisations such as NATO Centres of Excellence.

Aim: The bi-annual CD&E course provides students an introduction to NATO's concept

development, experimentation structure, and CD&E processes. Prior to COVID, the course was offered twice a year in May (HQ SACT, USA) and October (NSO, DEU). Course offerings may be adjusted or cancelled in 2021. Please visit the NSO webpage
