Background:

Reintegration is a critical component of Personnel Recovery (PR); however, it is often overshadowed by PR planning and the actual recovery operations. To complicate matters, in a resource-constrained environment, Reintegration is often overlooked, poorly addressed, or simply ignored. This project will aim to develop a baseline of best practices from which any nations may pull to establish or improve their own Reintegration program. It will address Reintegration best practices and lessons learned from all project participants. It will also aim to develop a community of interest for each core facet of reintegration (SERE psychologists and other medical specialists, medical facilities, Reintegration OPRs and SMEs, law enforcement agencies and other civilian entities, etc.) which will maintain the work initiated here and outlive this project.

Aim: This project aims to produce a report to outline a Reintegration baseline – a blue print for

nations to use as they establish their own programs, or menu for nations seeking to

update or improve their existing programs.
